Its special collections include primary sources in Indian, Chinese and Japanese thought and several language versions of the classic Buddhist canon. To promote greater academic and cultural exchange, The Institute had established the European Centre (near London), the European liaison office (Paris), the Indian Centre (New Delhi), the Russian Center (St. Petersburg), and the Hong Kong Centre.
